TO ALL PARENTS OF PUPILS IN YEAR 1 OF SECONDARY SCHOOL

Dear parents,

Your child will be completing his/her 1st year of secondary education at our school and we look forward to accompanying him/her into secondary 2. To enable us to prepare for the start of the new school year, we would ask you to check, complete and sign the attached form.

In secondary 2, the subjects your child will follow are the same as those chosen and followed in secondary 1, with the exception of the optional choice of beginning Latin.

The choice of Latin in S2 has several consequences:

- Students who choose the Latin option in S2 commit themselves for 2 years, i.e. they undertake to follow the option in S2 and S3. The course covers 2 periods per week.
- For internal organisational reasons, students who sign up for Latin will not have the opportunity to choose ICT in S3 (although they will be able to take ICT in S4, see below).

Details for future choices in the S4/S5 pre-orientation cycle

- Students who have taken Latin in S2/S3 (2 periods) will have the opportunity to continue taking Latin for 4 periods per week in S4/S5.
- Students who took Latin in S2/S3 but were unable to take ICT in S3 will be able to take the ICT option in S4/S5.

If you are unsure, or if your child is hesitating, we advise you to speak to his/her Language 1 teacher, who will certainly be able to help you make the right decision.

Given the ever-increasing importance of language teaching in the European Schools, Latin is normally taught in Language 1. However, if the number of pupils is not sufficient to create a group or if there is no qualified teacher available, Latin may be taught in L2 or, exceptionally, in L3.

For students of Irish, Maltese or Finnish origin - regardless of the language section in which the student is enrolled - you may optionally choose additional ONL (Other Native Language) teaching. ONL is taught for two periods per week. The creation of ONL courses is subject to teacher availability. It is not yet possible to indicate the precise timetable for these courses. It is possible that the lessons will take place during the student's free afternoon.

We would like to stress that the choices you make are final, as they form the basis for preparing class allocations and teacher assignments for the start of the new school year. Consequently, it will not be possible to change these choices unless there is a real and serious reason for considering an exceptional request for change.

The revised, amended and completed document must be **signed** and returned to the class teacher via your child **before 9 January 2026**.

Any request for a change will only be considered if it is submitted in writing to the S1-S3 cycle coordinator (Mr Federspiel Jean-Noël - federsje@eursc.eu) **before 1 July 2026**.

We look forward to welcoming your child in secondary 2.
